

REBRUARY, 2009 REPORT – ISAAC BRIGHT MENSAH
AKOTSI/OJOBI, GOMOA DISTRICT, CENTRAL REGION, GHANA, WEST AFRICA

INTRODUCTION

On the whole, the month of February, 2009 was not bad at all. All programmes and activities planned for the month were carefully executed. Three baptisms were recorded at Ojobi and Akraman.

OJOBI CHURCH

There were general church services on Sundays and other week days for prayer sessions and mid-week Bible classes.

The church continued in its general visitation aimed at restoring the backslidden brethren. Other activities planned for the month included children's Day which took place on 22nd February, 2009.

The programme allowed the children to invite their friends and peers to service and fellowship with them.

Average adult attendance was recorded on Sundays but still low in the night services.

One baptism was made on the 22nd February, 2009. This was a sister who had been visiting for a longer period.

AKOTSI CHURCH

The church was very vibrant in February after burying the most elderly sister amongst the brethren in the church. All programmes and activities for the month such as Sunday school, prayer service, mid-week Bible class and the normal Sunday worship service were all well attended.

The church also began work at the new site earmarked for the building of church auditorium. Weeds were cleared on portions of the land in order to continue with the block work.

AKRAMAN CHURCH

The work at Akraman is ongoing. Two of the brethren had travelled since January this year and other two have also gone back into the world. The rest have been very regular. The other sister congregations which were tasked to help with the organization of programmes especially on Sundays are really helping.

On 17th February, 2009 two persons were baptized, one being a regular visitor whose house the church meets and the other was won through evangelism work by the four (4) area preachers during our weekly meetings there.

PERSONAL WORK

There was an active personal evangelism work at Akraman. This includes Brother Jackson, Paul oti Kingsley and Frank Hotorwoshie.

I visited members who for some reasons could not be seen throughout the week in all the congregations. I also attended some meetings of the Area Churches in order to put in place the strengthening Programmes of the weaker congregations beginning in March 2009 at Gomoa Akraman.
